

**Clinical Instructor or Clinical Track Professor in Veterinary Dentistry and Oromaxillofacial
Surgery
University of Wisconsin-Madison**

The Department of Surgical Sciences, University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Veterinary Medicine invites applications for a full-time position as a Clinical Instructor or a Clinical Track (Assistant or Associate) Professor in the Dentistry and Oromaxillofacial Surgery Section. One position is available, and the title selected will be based on applicant qualifications and goals as well as departmental/section goals. Therefore, interested candidates are encouraged to apply for both positions. The successful applicant will join a team of 2 board certified veterinary dentists/oromaxillofacial surgeons who are also Founding Fellows-AVDC-Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Three AVDC residents and 2 licensed veterinary technicians complete the Dentistry and Oromaxillofacial Surgery team.

Qualifications: Candidates must have a DVM or equivalent degree with specialty training in dentistry and oral surgery. Board certification by the American Veterinary Dental College (AVDC) or European Veterinary Dental College (EVDC) is preferred but applicants that have completed residency training and whose credentials have been accepted by the AVDC/EVDC will be considered.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Required clinical duties will range between 40-44 weeks per year for clinical instructor and 22-26 weeks per year for clinical track professor. Clinical duties include participating in/leading resident-based and/or student-based rounds which involve approximately 3-5 hours per week while on clinics. Opportunities for providing dental care to a large variety of species are available if of interest to the candidate. Additional opportunities for formal AVDC training in oromaxillofacial surgery may be available to the appropriate candidate.

Clinicians in the clinical track at the University of Wisconsin are expected to teach third year students in the small animal surgery course, the advanced dentistry and oral surgery course, and the dentistry and oromaxillofacial surgery clinical rotation. Additional teaching opportunities may be available in other courses. Development of a research program as well as clinical and research supervision of residents in dentistry and oral surgery is also required. Successful candidates who are also AVDC fellows in OMFS may also be expected to participate in training OMFS fellow candidates. Participation in continuing education programs for practicing veterinarians is also expected.

For a clinical track appointment, distribution of time in clinical practice, teaching, research, and service is expected to be in the range of the following, depending on unit needs. Distribution for a clinical instructor would be 70-80% clinical practice, 10-20% non-clinical teaching and 10% service. Distribution for a clinical track professor position would be 40-50% clinical practice, 20% non-clinical teaching, 20-30% research and 10% service.
